◆ MAN CAUGHT AFTER MANHUNT

A McMinn County man, Michael Smith, is being held in the McMinn County Jail on charges of reckless endangerment, evading arrest, and driving on a revoked license. Smith was caught by State Trooper Kevin Hoppe after a manhunt Monday morning in the area of County Roads 316 and 274. Hoppe was in pursuit of a car which stopped on County Road 316 and a man jumped and ran. The man was spotted in a field and deputies tried to box him in. He managed to get away, but was caught by Trooper Hoppe on Co. Road 250.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ◆ Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak has gone on TV to announce he will not run for re-election. His announcement came after more than a quarter-million people protested in Cairo's main square Tuesday, demanding that he step down after nearly 30 years in power.
- ◆ Jordan's King Abdullah, II, bowed to public pressure and fired his government on Tuesday. He told his new prime minister to boost economic opportunities and give Jordanians a greater say in politics.
- ◆ Stocks rose sharply on Tuesday as investors focused more on strong earnings reports and less on the civil unrest in the Middle East. The DJIA closed at 12,040.16; up 148.23 points.
- ◆ Despite a federal judge's ruling that the health care law passed last year is unconstitutional, the Obama administration says the health care law will continue unless Congress votes to repeal the law or the U.S. Supreme Court rules it unconstitutional. A federal judge in Florida on Monday ruled the entire law unconstitutional, but he declined to block the law while the Obama administration appeals.
- ◆ A massive snow and ice storm closed roads and airports from Texas to Rhode Island. The storm could wreak havoc on agricultural operations in the midwest. Chicago expects two feet of snow.
- ◆ A new study by the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety says red light cameras have reduced the rate of fatal crashes by 24 percent in the 14 large cities that introduced the cameras between 1996 and 2004.
