### STATE AND LOCAL NEWS

#### ◆ HIXSON MAN KILLED IN HWY. 39 CRASH

Larry Lambert, 70, of Hixson died in a one-vehicle traffic crash this past Saturday in Englewood. State troopers say Lambert was driving his Jeep along Highway 39 just before 3:30 a.m. when he suddenly hit his brakes, skidded off the road, and over-corrected. His Jeep then struck an embankment and rolled over, ejecting him.

### NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ President Obama has challenged Congress to act immediately on his new jobs plan. Waving a copy of the legislation in the Rose Garden Monday, Obama demanded: "No games, no politics, no delays." The centerpiece of the plan cuts payroll taxes that pay for Social Security, giving a tax break to workers and businesses. There is also new spending for teachers and school construction and an extension of unemployment benefits past the current 99 weeks.
- ◆ Stocks were in a volatile session on Monday on concerns that Europe's debt crisis may spill over into the U.S. banking system. The Dow Jones Industrial Average closed up 68.99 at 11,061.12.
- ◆ The cartoon character SpongeBob SquarePants is in hot water due to a study suggesting that watching just nine minutes of the program can cause short-term attention and learning problems in 4-year-olds. A spokesman for SpongeBob says the show is aimed at kids ages 6-11, not 4-year-olds.
- ◆ Scientists tracking Happy Feet, the penguin who became a celebrity after washing up on a New Zealand beach, say they have lost contact with the bird. Researchers say they have received no transmissions since last Friday from a satellite tracking device that was attached to the penguin when he was released into the Southern Ocean on Sept. 4. They fear predators may have eaten him.

### THIS DAY IN HISTORY-Sept. 13

- 1788** - Congress authorized the first national election, to be held the first Wednesday in January 1789.
- 1851** - Surgeon Walter Reed was born. The Walter Reed Army Hospital in Washington was named after him.
- 1911** - The "father" of bluegrass, Bill Monroe, was born. His hits included "Blue Moon Of Kentucky," "Uncle Pen," and "Kentucky Waltz."
- 1922** - The temperature at El Azizia, Libya, reached 136 degrees Fahrenheit. That is generally accepted as the world's highest recorded temperature.
- 1925** - Singer Mel Torme was born. He wrote the popular Christmas song titled "The Christmas Song" about those chestnuts roasting on an open fire. Nat King Cole's recording made the song a Christmas classic.
- 1960** - The Federal Communications Commission banned payola after a scandal erupted involving radio station DJ's who accepted gifts and money from record promoters for playing certain recordings over the air.
