Local & State News

◆ POLK COUNTY MAN KILLED IN CRASH

Shawn Gregory Hall, 33, of Ocoee, died in a 3 vehicle crash on the Old Federal Road in Polk County last Thursday. Two of the vehicles hit head-on. Hall was an employee of Sentinel Fire Protection Company.

◆ GOVERNOR HASLAM SIGNS BILLS INTO LAW

Tennessee Governor Bill Haslam has made several year-end pieces of legislation the law of the land. One new law will allow judges to compel blood tests from motorists arrested on drunken driving charges. A new law will require that abortion doctors must have hospital privileges in the home or adjacent county of the woman who is seeking an abortion. Another bill will allow parents to sue teachers or outside groups that are working in schools that promote or condone "gateway sexual activity." The new pro-abstinence law has been criticized for being too vague and that hand-holding or kissing might provoke a lawsuit, while supporters say that sex-ed should not encourage or promote sexual experimentation, which some programs have done. Another new provision will move up the cut-off birthdate from September 30 to August 31st for Pre-K and Kindergarten in the 2013-2014 school year.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ The chairmen of the Senate and House Homeland Security Committees, leading a probe of the Secret Service, said that they plan to hold a May 23 Congressional hearing on the prostitution scandal that rocked the agency in April.

◆ It won't be nearly as controversial as Time magazine's breastfeeding cover, but Newsweek's May 21 issue declares Barack Obama the country's "first gay president." The accompanying cover story was written by Andrew Sullivan, the popular--and openly gay--political blogger.

◆ Three high-ranking executives at JPMorgan Chase are expected to leave their jobs this week after a trading blunder cost the bank \$2 billion.

◆ Forty-nine decapitated and mutilated bodies were found Sunday dumped on a highway connecting the northern Mexican metropolis of Monterrey to the U.S. border in what appeared to be the latest blow in an escalating war among drug gangs.

◆ A drawing based on information from inside an Iranian military site shows an explosives containment chamber of the type needed for nuclear arms-related tests that U.N. inspectors suspect Tehran has conducted there.
