NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ President Obama may be facing an International lawsuit after he took the highly unusual step of blocking a Chinese company from building wind farms in Oregon. The Chinese company, Ralls, is furious and has threatened to sue the president.
- ◆ A recall of peanut butter and other nut products has some of the country's largest grocery stores pulling store-brand products off their shelves. New Mexico-based Sunland Inc. has expanded its recall of peanut butter and almond butter to include cashew butters, tahini and blanched and roasted peanut products. Many name brand products contain items produced by Sunland Inc. The Food and Drug Administration blames a salmonella outbreak in 19 states for causing the recall.
- ◆ Authorities say at least 20 passengers suffered minor to moderate injuries when a big rig truck collided with a southbound Amtrak train in the Central Valley in California.
- ◆ NASA's Mars rover Curiosity is enjoying some nice, warm weather on the Red Planet, and spring hasn't even come to its landing site yet. Curiosity's onboard weather station has measured air temperatures as high as 43 degrees Fahrenheit (6 degrees Celsius) in the afternoon.

McMillin, age 24, was killed Friday when he lost control of his motorcycle rounding a curve. Both McMillin and the bike fell 75 feet down an embankment. He was taken to U.T. Medical Center and pronounced dead on arrival. He was a Lance Corporal in the U.S. Marine Corps.

- Tourism in Bradley County set a new record in 2011, bringing in about \$112 million. Tourism revenue for all 95 counties in Tennessee increased in 2011.
