◆ TREE LIMB TAKES 600 CUSTOMERS OFFLINE

A power outage Wednesday around 7:50 a.m. is being blamed on a large tree limb falling and taking down all three phases of a primary wire located on South Jackson Street. AUB Assistant Manager Wayne Scarbrough says that repair crews replaced the wires and got power restored around 9:09 a.m.

World & National News

◆ Turkey's military has hit targets inside Syria in response to a mortar bomb fired from Syrian territory which killed five Turkish civilians. In the most serious cross-border escalation of the 18-month uprising in Syria, Turkey hit back at what it called "the last straw" when a mortar hit a residential neighborhood of the border town of Akcakale. NATO called an urgent meeting to discuss the matter.

◆ Mexican troops have arrested two men suspected of involvement in the killing of a U.S. Border Patrol agent shot dead in Arizona while responding to a tripped ground sensor. The agent who died was among three who were patrolling on foot about 5 miles north of the international border when gunfire erupted well before daybreak on Tuesday. A second agent was also wounded while the third, a woman, was unharmed.

◆ Next Monday over New Mexico, "Fearless Felix" Baumgartner will attempt the highest, fastest free fall in history and try to become the first skydiver to break the sound barrier. The 43-year-old former military parachutist from Austria is hoping to reach 690 mph, or Mach 1, after leaping from his balloon-hoisted capsule 23 miles high over the desert near Roswell.

Volume on the New York Stock Exchange was 616.14 million shares traded. In commodity markets, the spot price of gold rose \$3.65 to \$1,778.35. The spot price of silver fell \$0.02 to \$34.60, and crude oil prices fell \$3.89 to \$88.00 per barrel.

Today in History-October 4

- 1535** - The first printing of the entire Bible in English was completed.
- 1822** - President Rutherford B. Hayes was born in Ohio. He reportedly enjoyed books more than politics. After being nominated for Congress, he refused to take time out from fighting in the Civil War to campaign.
- 1929** - Country singer Leroy Van Dyke was born. His biggest hit was "The Auctioneer." Van Dyke, himself, was a licensed auctioneer.
- 1957** - One of the best-loved family TV programs--"Leave It To Beaver"--premiered on CBS on this date, starring Jerry Mathers as The Beaver.
- 1957** - The Space Age began as the Soviet Union launched Sputnik, the first man-made satellite, into orbit.
- 1958** - The first trans-Atlantic passenger jetliner service was begun by British Overseas Airways Corp. with flights between London and New York.
- 1990** - German lawmakers held the first meeting of the reunified country's parliament in the Reichstag in Berlin.
- 2002** - Richard Reid pleaded guilty in a federal court to trying to blow up a trans-Atlantic flight with explosives hidden in his shoes.
