Local & State News

◆ METH LAB FIRE LEADS TO INDICTMENTS

A McMinn County woman, Angelia Diane Bentley, age 49, of Athens, was indicted by the McMinn County Grand Jury after a meth lab fire was traced to a residence where she was employed as a caregiver for an elderly couple. On September 10th a garbage truck reported that some of its trash was on fire. McMinn Deputy Daniel Lantz discovered a bag "giving off smoke" in the garbage that contained meth components. Detective Chad Bogle discovered a receipt in the bag from Lowes on the same date for plastic tubing. Store video confirmed the purchase. The trash bag was traced to the home of Lloyd and Maryellen Kimbrough on County Road 146, where Bentley and another woman, Rebecca Torbett, were caregivers. Detective Bogle discovered other controlled substances in Bentley's car and purse, including the Kimbrough's personal information, drivers license, and ATM card as well as evidence that Bentley was making unauthorized withdrawals from the Kimbrough's bank account. Bentley now faces numerous drug and theft charges. She was arrested and taken to the McMinn County Jail and is being held on a \$150,000 bond.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Lance Armstrong's final escape route was closed to him on Monday, when The UCI, the world governing body of cycling, upheld the findings of a report by the United States Anti-Doping Agency on Monday. The International Cycling Union stripped Lance Armstrong of his Tour de France titles. Armstrong was accused of masterminding a doping strategy that involved prohibited drugs, blood transfusions and elaborate schemes to fool testing authorities.

◆ Investigators are attempting to discover what led to the contamination of medications behind an outbreak of fungal meningitis which led to the deaths of 23 people. People at St Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor, Michigan are confused, fearful and angry as they deal with the uncertainty of whether they are infected, and grapple with how their course of treatment will proceed.

◆ Antoni Dobrowolski, the oldest known survivor of the Auschwitz concentration camp, died Sunday in the northwestern Polish town of Debno at the age of 108. Dobrowolski was a teacher who gave lessons in defiance of his native Poland's Nazi occupiers.

Monday's Market Closings

The Dow Jones Industrial Average closed up 2.38 at 13,345.89. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 0.62 at 1,433.81. The NASDAQ Composite Index was up 11.34 at 3,016.96. In commodity markets, the spot price of gold rose \$6.20 to \$1,727.95, the spot price of silver rose \$0.31 to \$32.39, and crude oil prices fell \$1.32 to \$88.73 per barrel. In the bond market, the 30-year Treasury yield closed at 2.97%, and the 10-year Treasury yield finished at 1.81%.

A man in upstate New York finally has his wristwatch back, 53 years after it was stolen. Ed Grigor says he had long ago forgotten about the 23-jewel wristwatch stolen when he was in the Navy. Then last month he got a call from a Las Vegas couple. They were able to track down Grigor because his name was engraved on the back of the watch.
