State & Local News

◆ **JUVENILE VANDALISM-THEFT RING BROKEN**
 A cooperative effort by the McMinn County Sheriff's Office and Englewood Police has shut-down a juvenile crime ring and solved numerous vandalisms and thefts. On April 13th, a group of 4 juveniles attempted to break in the Englewood Jiffy Market. They were apprehended by Englewood Police Officer Nick Purkey. On suspicion that the juveniles might be involved with other recent crimes, Purkey and Englewood Chief Darrel Wright contacted Sheriff's Detective Gary Miller. Interviews were conducted with the juveniles and their parents. Sheriff Guy stated, "that based upon the evidence as well as from the interviews, a total number of 7 juvenile suspects were identified." The cooperative effort solved vandalisms and thefts in the area, including three incidents at the Englewood Jiffy, the Quick Stop Market in Etowah, the baseball and softball press-boxes and concession stands at Central High School, Bob's Discount on Hwy 39E, the Goodsprings House of Prayer, numerous vandalism cases involving vehicles and private property, and the destruction of mailboxes on County Roads 609, 461, & 508. The juveniles were released to the custody of their parents and will likely appear in Juvenile Court on April 22nd.

World & National News

- ◆ Authorities have a clear picture of a potential suspect in the Boston Marathon bombings, taken from cameras at Lord & Taylor along the marathon route, and are in the process of identifying the individual. At this time, no one has been arrested according to the Boston Police Department and the FBI.
- ◆ Letters addressed to President Obama and Mississippi Senator Roger Wicker both tested positive for the poison ricin according to federal authorities. Ricin is a naturally occurring toxin from castor beans generated from castor-oil plants and can kill within a matter of hours.
- ◆ The proposal by Sens. Joe Manchin, D-W.Va., and Pat Toomey, R-Pa., to expand background checks for people buying guns online and at gun shows fell six votes short of winning the 60 votes needed to pass. The vote was 54 to 46. Vice President Biden reacted with scorn saying: "This is far from over." The NRA issued a statement calling the amendment "misguided." NRA spokesman Chris Cox said in a statement that this amendment would have criminalized certain private transfers of firearms between honest citizens, requiring lifelong friends, neighbors and some family members to get federal government permission to exercise a fundamental right or face prosecution.
