Local and State News

◆ WATTS BAR GUNMAN STILL AT LARGE

A gunman is still on the loose following a shootout with a TVA security officer on the perimeter of the Watts Bar Nuclear Plant early Sunday.

TVA authorities say the security officer was on routine patrol on the banks of Chickamauga Lake around 2 a.m. Sunday when he spotted a man near an old boat ramp in a restricted area of the plant property. When the officer confronted the man, he fired at the officer. The bullet struck the officer's vehicle. The officer returned fire and called for backup. Multiple rounds were fired. The security officer was not hurt. The suspect managed to get away.

As a result of the incident, Watts Bar declared a low-level emergency until the nuclear plant property was searched by agents on the ground and by helicopter and declared secure. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission sent two security inspectors to the plant to review the incident and TVA's response. The FBI has also joined the investigation.

It was unclear how the gunman got away. One source said he may have left by boat. It was also unclear why the intruder was on the Watts Bar property.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Dzhokhar Tsarnaev, the terror suspect of the Boston Marathon bombing last Monday, has been charged with two federal counts of using a weapon of mass destruction to kill, injure and cause widespread damage. Tsarnaev who is 19, faces the death penalty if convicted. Three people were killed and more than 200 others were wounded.

◆ Canadian police said on Monday they had arrested and charged Chiheb Esseghaier, 30, of Montreal, and Raed Jaser, 35, of Toronto with an "al Qaeda-supported" plot to derail a passenger train which, if it had been carried out, would have resulted in innocent people being killed or seriously injured. The Royal Canadian Mounted Police said it was not linked to the Boston Marathon bombings, but likely had connections to al-Qaeda. Neither is a Canadian citizen.

◆ In West, Texas, city officials warned that hundreds of residents could be without water for at least a week or more because pipes and other utility infrastructure were "severely damaged" in last Wednesday's deadly explosion at a fertilizer plant.

◆ Richie Havens, the folk singer and guitarist who was the first performer at Woodstock, died Monday. He was 72. Havens died of a heart attack in New Jersey. He was born in Brooklyn.

MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks erased early morning losses and closed slightly higher after investors weighed corporate earnings results against weak housing data. In corporate news, Dow component Caterpillar missed earnings estimates and cut its full-year outlook for 2013. U.S. bond prices ended higher on the negative economic news. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 19.66 at 14,567.17. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 7.25 at 1,562.50, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 27.50 at 3,233.55. In commodity markets, the spot price of gold rose \$22.15 to \$1,426.00. The spot price of silver rose \$0.19 to \$23.44, and crude oil prices rose \$1.01 to \$89.28.
