Local & State News

◆ ATHENS POLICE & FIRE REPORT

Athens Police Chief Chuck Ziegler's monthly report to the Athens City Council shows the number of thefts in the city is up this year compared to last year. There were 76 thefts in April, bringing the total number of thefts in 2013 to 273. For the same period last year, the number was 256. Chief Ziegler's report also shows there were 25 assaults in April, 19 burglaries, 5 motor vehicle thefts, 32 drug arrests, and 733 citations for moving traffic violations. There were 54 traffic accidents in Athens in April involving 11 injuries.

Fire Chief Jim Dyer reported the Athens Fire Department responded to 24 calls in April. Five calls involved vehicle accidents, three were trash fires, and two were false alarms. Other calls involved gas leaks, EMS assists, a smoke scare and unauthorized burning.

The Athens City Council presented a Distinguished Service Award to Patrol Officer Don Nation for outstanding performance during a medical emergency incident in April. Officer Nation responded to a home on Watts Road where Ashley Pope was going into labor. He helped her husband, Daniel, deliver a baby girl on the front porch of the home.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ First responders continue to sift through debris in southern Oklahoma City and other towns, to try to find survivors in the devastated region. According to Oklahoma Governor Mary Fallin, twenty-four people have been confirmed dead, including 9 children and 237 people were injured.

◆ Douglas Shulman, former Internal Revenue Service Commissioner, said that he was not personally responsible for the agency's practice of placing elevated scrutiny on conservative groups that applied for nonprofit status, but that he regrets it occurred during his tenure and on his watch.

◆ Jodi Arias asked jurors to give her life in prison, claiming she lacked perspective when she stated after she was convicted of murder that she preferred execution to spending the rest of her days in jail. She told jurors that she planned to use her time in prison to bring about positive changes, including donating her hair to be made into wigs for cancer victims, helping recycle trash and designing T-shirts that would raise money for victims of domestic abuse.

◆ The 50th Super Bowl, which will be played in 2016, will be held in the San Francisco Bay Area.

1813 - German composer Richard Wagner was born. He wrote the Processional Wedding March (better known as "Here Comes the Bride").

1859 - Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, creator of Sherlock Holmes, was born.

1861 - In what is generally regarded as the first Union combat fatality of the Civil War, Pvt. Thornsby Bailey Brown was shot and killed by a Confederate soldier at Fetterman Bridge in present-day West Virginia.

1907 - Actor Sir Laurence Olivier was born.

1939 - The foreign ministers of Germany and Italy signed a "Pact of Steel" committing the two countries to a military alliance.
