NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ A cadre of the Hollywood left; Alec Baldwin, Matt Damon and John Cusack, are among the actors starring in a new video urging President Obama to "set the world's course" for an end to nuclear weapons at this week's G8 Summit in Northern Ireland.
- ◆ North Korea's top governing body has proposed high-level nuclear and security talks with the United States in an appeal sent just days after calling off talks with rival South Korea.
- ◆ At least 24 men convicted or charged with murder or rape based on bite marks on the flesh of victims have been exonerated since 2000, many after spending more than a decade in prison. Now a judge's ruling later this month in New York could help end the practice for good.
- ◆ Europe is mired in debt and recession. Financial markets have hit violent ups and downs on fears that U.S. stimulus efforts may soon be scaled back. Japan is finally looking up after years of stagnation but it remains an open question if Japan's recovery will continue.
- ◆ Current and former top U.S. officials have defended the government's collection of phone and Internet data following new revelations about the secret surveillance programs.

FRIDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks retreated as the International Monetary Fund cut its 2014 American growth forecast and cautioned the Fed to carefully manage its tapering of stimulus measures. The IMF's announcement, combined with a weaker-than-expected consumer confidence report, helped push stocks into negative territory for the day. U.S. Treasury prices finished higher as investors renewed their confidence that the Fed will continue its efforts in the near future. The Dow Jones Industrial Average fell 177 points, or 1.1%, for the week. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 105.90 at 15,070.18. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 9.63 at 1,626.73, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 21.81 at 3,423.56.

TODAY IN HISTORY-Jun 17

1703 - John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, was born in England. He was one of 19 children. In the 1730's he traveled to the American colony of Georgia where he attempted to convert the Indians.

1775 - The Battle of Bunker Hill took place in Boston in the American Revolutionary War. The actual battle took place on Breed's Hill, a short distance to the east of Bunker Hill.

1856 - The Republican Party opened its first convention, in Philadelphia.

1885 - The Statue of Liberty arrived in New York City aboard the French ship Isere.

1928 - Amelia Earhart embarked on the first trans-Atlantic flight by a woman.

1942 - *Suspense*, known as radio's outstanding theatre of thrills, debuted on CBS radio. It still airs on "When Radio Was" on WYXI AM-1390, weeknights at 6 p.m.

1946 - Singer Barry Manilow was born. His hits include "I Write the Songs" and "Can't Smile Without You."
