Local and State News

◆ PLANNING COMMISSION MEETS TODAY

The Athens Municipal-Regional Planning Commission will meet at noon today in the conference room at the Athens Municipal Building. On the agenda: Final Plat Approval for Athens Property Group for Phase I of Foxwood subdivision fronts on Co. Road 378; Final Plat Approval for Habitat for Humanity for a subdivision that fronts Hammerhill Road and Tellico Avenue; Commercial Access Request on John J. Duncan Blvd (Hwy 305) for a new Subway; and Final Plat Approval request for Sheri Stewart for a subdivision that has frontage on Lark Lane.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ Republican House Speaker John Boehner has vowed not to raise the U.S. debt ceiling without a "serious conversation" about what is driving the debt, while Democrats said it was irresponsible and reckless to raise the possibility of a U.S. default. Meanwhile, House Speaker Boehner said he sees no way out of the government shut-down unless the President is willing to engage in negotiations with Republicans.
- ◆ International inspectors have begun the enormous task of destroying Syria's stockpile of chemical weapons and the machinery used to create it. The goal is to meet a tight deadline to eliminate President Bashar Assad's chemical weapons program.
- ◆ An out-of-control monster truck shot into a crowd of spectators at a Mexican air show over the weekend, killing at least eight people, and injuring 80 more people, some of them seriously.
- ◆ A tiger bit a worker, and almost severed her arm, at an Oklahoma zoo, when she reached into its cage. First aid responders were able to render enough aid so that the injured woman could be airlifted to a hospital for surgery. Doctors were able to save her arm.
- ◆ Canada has approved a \$35 billion investment by Malaysian Energy Company Petronas to build a giant Liquefied Natural Gas plant and pipeline in Canada. The valuable resource will be shipped to and sold in East Asia.

TODAY IN HISTORY-OCTOBER 7

1849 - Author Edgar Allan Poe died at age 40.

1916 - The most lopsided football game on record took place when Coach John Heisman's Georgia Tech clobbered Cumberland University of Tennessee, 222 to 0.

1922 - The first radio network made its debut. It was a network of just two stations. WJZ in Newark, NJ teamed with WGY in Schenectady, NY to bring the World Series game direct from the Polo Grounds in New York. Columnist Grantland Rice was behind the microphone for that historic radio broadcast.

1968 - The Motion Picture Association of America adopted a film-rating system.

1985 - Palestinian terrorists hijacked an Italian cruise ship, the "Achille Lauro," with more than 400 passengers and crew off Egypt. They demanded that Israel release 50 Palestinian prisoners. An American, Leon Klinghoffer, was killed before the crisis ended.

1996 - Fox News Channel made its debut.
