State & Local News

◆ **ETOWAH MAN KILLED IN FRIDAY WRECK**
 Dustin Watson, age 27, died early Friday morning when his 2000 model Ford pickup truck left the roadway, and for some unknown reason, began to slide sideways, striking a tree on the driver's side door. The wreck happened on County Road 119 West, just a short distance outside the Athens City Limits. He was pronounced dead at the scene at around 12:52 a.m. His truck was the only vehicle involved in the crash and there were no other passengers.

◆ **CHARGES UPGRADED TO MURDER**
 Athens Police have charged Adrian Hall, age 41, with Second Degree Murder in the death of his wife, 51-year-old Janie Arlene Hall. Mrs. Hall was found unconscious on Friday, June 6th, near Athens Fire Station #2, on Velma Road at Congress Parkway. Adrian Hall told police that he and his wife were living in a tent in the nearby woods. He claimed that he threw a metal tent pole at a skunk that invaded their tent, but hit his wife's leg by mistake, causing a deep cut. Mrs. Hall bled to death before reaching the hospital. Detectives say the story didn't hold up, because there was no skunk smell at the tent, Mrs. Hall's air mattress wasn't punctured, and a bloody knife was found near a large amount of blood. Adrian Hall (see photo) was originally charged with aggravated assault. He remains in the McMinn County Jail under \$25,000 bond.



WORLD & NATIONAL NEWS

◆ The Islamic militant group that captured two major cities in Iraq last week, has posted graphic photos that appeared to show its fighters massacring hundreds of captured Iraqi soldiers.
 ◆ President Obama has ordered an aircraft carrier into the Persian Gulf over the Iraq crisis, where Sunni Arab jihadists have seized a large part of the country. Now, it appears that Shi'ite Iran said it would consider "helping" the U.S. if President Obama should take action. Iraqi commanders said that their soldiers had recaptured two towns north of Baghdad, and thousands of volunteers have answered a call to arms.
 ◆ Commuter rail service in the Philadelphia area was restored early Sunday, just hours after workers returned to their jobs following a brief strike that was ended when President Obama intervened.
 ◆ Israeli troops on Sunday arrested some 80 Palestinians, including dozens of members of Hamas, in an overnight raid in the West Bank. Israel's prime minister, Benjamin Netanyahu, accused the Islamic militant group of kidnapping three teenagers who went missing several days ago. One of the teens is an American.
 ◆ A central Florida woman faces petty theft charges after officials say she stuffed seven frozen lobster tails in her pants and walked out of a Publix supermarket without paying for them.
