◆ ONE PERSON DIES IN CRASH WITH AMBULANCE

A Morristown man died early Monday morning when his car plowed into the back of an AMR ambulance on I-75 northbound near mile marker 56. The ambulance was stopped in the left lane with lights flashing, and the crew was outside of the vehicle checking on a prior accident in the median. State Trooper Curtis Walker says a car driven by Christopher Webb, 40, struck the un-occupied ambulance at full impact without braking. He was dead on the scene. The accident happened around 4:45 a.m. Northbound traffic on I-75 was blocked until 9 a.m., with traffic diverted at exit 52 and along State Highway 305 to U.S. 11.

◆ Kentucky Clerk Kim Davis had her name removed from the first marriage license issued to a same-sex couple following her return to work in Rowan County early Monday morning.

◆ The Pentagon has confirmed that Russia is expanding its military presence in Syria and that the flow of Russian equipment and personnel into the airbase at Latakia, Syria indicate that Russia plans on establishing a forward air operating base there.

TODAY IN HISTORY - SEPTEMBER 15

- 1789** - American novelist James Fennimore Cooper was born. He wrote "The Last of the Mohicans."
- 1821** - Costa Rica, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua and El Salvador became independent from Spain.
- 1857** - Our 27th President, William Howard Taft, was born. He did not enjoy being president and called the White House "the loneliest place in the world."
- 1885** - The world-famous elephant "Jumbo" died after being hit by a train. He had performed in P.T. Barnum's circus all over the world.
- 1903** - Country singer Roy Acuff was born. His biggest hits were "Wabash Cannon Ball" and "The Great Speckled Bird."
- 1916** - Tanks were used in war for the first time. The Allies used them on the Western Front during World War One.
- 1917** - Russia was proclaimed a republic by Alexander Kerensky, the head of a provisional government.
- 1963** - Four black girls were killed when a bomb exploded during Sunday services at a Baptist church in Birmingham, Alabama, in the deadliest act of the civil rights era.
- 1973** - Secretariat won the Marlboro Cup and set a world record for the 1-1/8 mile event. The legendary thoroughbred won in 1 minute, 45-2/3 seconds and earned \$250,000.
- 1982** - The first edition of the USA Today newspaper was published.
- 2000** - The Summer Olympics opened in Sydney, Australia.
- 2008** - Lehman Brothers Holdings Inc. filed for bankruptcy protection – the largest in U.S. history.
