NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ An arrest has been made in connection with a string of shootings in Arizona. Arizona Governor Doug Ducey announced that a SWAT team was in custody of 21-year-old Leslie Allen Merritt Jr. who is suspected of the I-10 shootings in Phoenix.
- ◆ Pope Francis will be in the U.S. this week. UPS says that his visit will disrupt package pickup and deliveries in Washington, New York City, and Philadelphia and likely will affect other parts of the country as a result.
- ◆ Republican presidential candidate Ben Carson is drawing fire from muslim organizations after saying on "Meet the Press" that Islam is antithetical to the Constitution, and he doesn't believe that a Muslim should ever be elected president..

FOOTBALL SCORES: Cleveland defeated McMinn County 34 to 27. McMinn Central crushed Loudon 66 to 35. Meigs County beat Silverdale 43 to 7. Tennessee whipped Western Carolina 55 to 10. It was the first time that Tennessee recorded a kickoff return TD and a punt return TD in the same game since Oct. 28, 1950, against Washington & Lee. Tennessee has scored 138 points over its first three games. The last time that record was surpassed was in 1914, when UT scored 171 points.

More Area and State News

◆ The McMinn County Economic Development Authority has designated September 28 - October 2 as Industry Week which coincides with National Manufacturing Day, which is October 1st. A Career Expo will be hosted at McMinn County High School on October 1st. The Expo will introduce county-wide high school seniors to what industries are located in McMinn County, what they produce, the pay scales of different industrial careers, and the skills required to be employed at local industries. Kathy Price, the Executive Director of the McMinn County Economic Development Authority, says that more than 1 out of every 3 people employed in McMinn County work in manufacturing.

◆ The shooting last Wednesday in Meigs County that resulted in the death of 52-year-old Timothy Johnson, involved an argument over a prize-winning fighting rooster. Timothy Johnson went to the Ten Mile home of his nephew, Larry Johnson, Jr., age 27, and accused him of stealing his rooster. Both men fired at each other. Larry Johnson was shot and was taken to U.T. Medical Center where he was in critical condition. Timothy Johnson was found dead lying in the driveway of his nephew's home.

◆ The CEO of Volkswagen said he is deeply sorry for breaking the trust of his customers and the public. An EPA investigation shows VW manipulated software in testing its diesel cars, that allowed them to meet emissions standards they otherwise would have failed. Some of the cars were made at the new VW plant in Chattanooga.
