◆ UPDATE ON ATHENS JANUARY MURDER

Athens Police Chief Chuck Ziegler says investigators have not been able to come up with any new information about the shooting death of 51-year-old Keith Harris Tyler on January 6th. Tyler was shot in the head by two males who came into an apartment on Forrest Avenue and started shooting. A woman in the apartment was shot in the hand. No arrests have been made. Chief Ziegler says detectives are still working with the original information.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ◆ The FBI has unlocked the iPhone used by one of the San Bernardino terrorist attackers. A key court hearing was abruptly cancelled after the FBI said it no longer needed Apple's help because it had found an outside party to unlock the phone.
- ◆ Democratic presidential front-runner Hillary Clinton rebuked Senate Republicans for denying a hearing to U.S. Supreme Court nominee Merrick Garland. Clinton accused them of obstructionism, and warned of dangers if Donald Trump appointed the next justice.
- ◆ Donald Trump's presidential campaign manager, Corey Lewandowski, was arrested and charged with misdemeanor battery in Florida on Tuesday. Lewandowski was charged with intentionally grabbing and bruising the arm of Michelle Fields, then a reporter for the conservative news outlet Breitbart, when she tried to question Trump at a campaign event on March 8. Donald Trump is defending Lewandowski, saying he is innocent and will fight the charges while continuing as campaign manager.
- ◆ Fidel Castro responded to President Obama's historic trip to Cuba with a long, bristling letter recounting the history of U.S. aggression against Cuba, and writing, "we don't need the empire to give us any presents."
