Local & State News

◆ FORMER FIRST LADY AT TWC DIES

Well-known author, columnist, and speaker Nell Mohny died Tuesday in Chattanooga. She was 94. Mrs. Mohny was the author of 13 books and wrote a column for the Chattanooga newspaper for 38 years. She was also a popular speaker at church, business, and professional events. She was well-known in Athens. Her late husband, Dr. Ralph Mohny, served as president of Tennessee Wesleyan College from 1959 to 1965.



◆ ETOWAH TO RECEIVE TOURISM GRANT

Etowah is one of 29 communities across the state to receive Tourism Enhancement Grants from the Tennessee Departments of Tourism Development and Economic and Community Development. The grants are to be used to assist the communities with tourism infrastructure assets. Etowah will receive \$50,000. Both Meigs County and Monroe County will receive \$20,000 grants to enhance their tourism.

NATIONAL & STATE NEWS

◆ A Baltimore police body camera caught a distracted "Pokemon Go" driver crashing into a parked police patrol car early Monday morning.

◆ Turkey's President Recep Erdogan declared a three-month state of emergency, after a failed military coup attempted to remove his government from power. Human rights group Amnesty International issued a strong condemnation of the government crackdown, alleging that many of those detained have been ill-treated in custody and denied access to lawyers.

◆ The Australian government believes the wing flap discovered on Pemba Island near Tanaznia belongs to the missing airliner from Malaysia Airlines Flight 370.

◆ For the second straight day, traffic on Interstate 75 in East Tennessee was blocked by truck wrecks. Early Wednesday, an 18-wheeler collided head-on with an SUV on I-75/I-40 in downtown Knoxville. The truck erupted into flames. Both drivers were killed. Traffic was blocked for about 10 hours.

TODAY IN HISTORY - JULY 21st

1861 - The first major battle of the Civil War took place at Bull Run Creek in Manassas, Virginia.

1873 - The James-Younger gang, led by notorious outlaw Jesse James, robbed the Rock Island Express train at Adair, Iowa. They escaped with \$3,000. It was the first train robbery in the western U.S.

1899 - Novelist Ernest Hemingway was born. His bestselling books included "The Old Man and the Sea," "A Farewell to Arms," and "For Whom the Bell Tolls."

1922 - Singer Kay Starr was born. Her hit records included "Wheel Of Fortune," "Rock And Roll Waltz," and "My Heart Reminds Me."

1925 - The Scopes "monkey trial" ended in Dayton, Tennessee, with John T. Scopes convicted of violating state law for teaching Darwin's theory of evolution. (The conviction was later overturned.)

1969 - Apollo 11 astronauts Neil Armstrong and Edwin "Buzz" Aldrin blasted off from the moon aboard the lunar module.
