Local & State News

◆ TRUMP COACH ROLLS INTO ATHENS

A lot of Donald Trump supporters gathered in Downtown Athens Monday afternoon when the Trump-Pence Campaign Coach pulled into town. The coach stopped at Market Park. Neither Trump nor his running mate, Gov. Mike Pence, was on board. Several local Republican leaders, including State Representative John Forgety, Sheriff Joe Guy, McMinn County Party Chairman, Mark Cochran, County Mayor John Gentry, and Congressman Chuck Fleischmann's local representative, Maxine Gernert, held a "get out the vote" rally.




NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

◆ Nearly three weeks after Hurricane Matthew roared through Haiti, killing hundreds and leaving behind a trail of destruction, an estimated 1.4 million people are in need of food assistance.

◆ On Monday, authorities began evicting immigrants from the sprawling, cramped makeshift refugee camp dubbed "The Jungle" in the northern port city of Calais, France. Some are refusing to leave and many do not want to stay in France but dream of getting to the U.K. The U.K. has already started to accept some of the migrant camp's 1,300 unaccompanied children.

◆ ATHENS PUBLIC WORKS HEAD TO RESIGN

Shawn Lindsey has announced his plans to resign as the Athens Public Works Director effective December 2nd. Lindsey says he has accepted a job as executive director of Spearhead Trails in the coal mining region of southwest Virginia. Lindsey will be in charge of some 350 miles of trails. He has been the Athens Public Works director for nearly 12 years. During his time in Athens, he has been able to improve recycling and the animal shelter, and has helped build sidewalks and control flooding. Lindsey says he feels it is time to do something different, and he feels God has led him to Spearhead Trails.
