♦ AUB TO WAIVE SOME LATE FEES

Athens Utilities Board is waiving late fees on customer bills that were recently mailed later than normal, creating a short period of time between the date the customer received the bill and the due date. The bills in question were issued by AUB on January 28th and show a payment due date of February 7th. The bills affected have account numbers starting with 40, 42, 44, 46, and 52. If your account number begins with any of those numbers and shows a due date of February 7th, you are included in the late fee waiver. However, customers will need to pay their bill promptly to avoid being at risk of disconnection if the bill goes unpaid altogether.

◆ 2nd AMENDMENT SALES TAX HOLIDAY?

A bill proposed in the Tennessee Legislature would create a sales tax holiday for guns and ammunition. The bill was filed by Republican Representative Dennis Powers. It calls for a "Second Amendment sales tax holiday" on the first weekend of September each year. It would be similar to the sales tax holiday on school items held each year, just before school opens.
