♦ YOU MAY HAVE SOME UNCLAIMED MONEY

The Tennessee Treasury Department returned 41,827 claims of unclaimed property in Fiscal Year 2016, marking a 28% increase over the previous year. This is the highest number of claims ever returned, with more than \$34 million returned last year. The average claim amount was \$817. Unclaimed property is money that has been turned over to the State by businesses and organizations who cannot locate the rightful owners. Every year, millions of dollars are turned over, and the Tennessee Treasury Department works to get that money back to the rightful owners. There is currently more than \$789 million in unclaimed property still waiting to be returned. The funds may include stocks, bonds, gift certificates, checks, unclaimed wages, refunds from utility and other companies, and life insurance annuities. There is no time limit in Tennessee to claim unclaimed property. It is held for the rightful owner or their legal beneficiaries until it is claimed. Tennessee's Unclaimed Property Division works throughout the year using a variety of methods to track down the owners of the money. You can visit the website www.ClaimitTN.gov to search for your name, and can file your claim online. You should also search for common misspellings of your name. One of our Morning Fax editors went to that website and found over a dozen of his relatives that had money coming to them. The amounts ranged from a few dollars to "over \$250."
