

## FAIRVIEW BAPTIST UPDATE

It's been 12 weeks since the tornado ripped across the Athens area, destroying houses, business, and churches. The hardest-hit church was Fairview Baptist, where four buildings were destroyed. At this point, four buildings have been demolished. They were the Shock Chapel, the fellowship hall, the two-story educational building, and the gymnasium. Plans to rebuild are on the drawing board. Church leaders say construction should begin in the late spring with a projected completion date of approximately one year. In the meantime, the church is holding services at the former American Bedding building on Dennis Street and Fairview Christian Academy is meeting at the former Four Star Academy on Matlock Road.
