THIRD MURDER SUSPECT IS SENTENCED

The third member of the trio charged in the murder of 20-year-old Tyler Womack, which occurred July 4th, 2014, has been sentenced. Martha Ann Thompson was sentenced to 10 years in prison after pleading guilty this week to charges of facilitation of second-degree murder, aggravated burglary, and theft. Thomas Odum was found guilty of first degree murder last June and sentenced to life in prison. Amanda Lee Britnell pleaded guilty to first degree murder last August and was also sentenced to life in prison. Womack was shot and killed when he surprised the three as they burglarized a house on County Road 172.
