National - World News

- ◆ Wikileaks released what the whistleblower group claimed were thousands of secret CIA files showing how U.S. spies hack smartphones, as well as exposing a major secret listening post in Germany. The Office of the Director of National Intelligence declined to comment, and the CIA in a statement would not say whether the files were real or not.
- ◆ At least 30 people have been killed and more than 50 others injured when ISIS gunmen dressed as medics stormed a military hospital in Kabul Wednesday morning.
- ◆ The U.S. ambassador to the United Nations, Nikki Haley, said the U.S. is reevaluating its approach to North Korea after the country launched five ballistic missiles earlier in the week.
- ◆ Nineteen teens were killed and about 25 more were injured in a fire at a children's care home in Guatemala. The shelter houses those up to the age of 18 who have been abused, abandoned or the victims of trafficking.
- ◆ Women across the country stayed home from work and marched in rallies on Wednesday to bolster the cause for women's rights in the workplace as part of International Women's Day.
- ◆ The National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration said that the nation went through the second warmest February on record last month, and one of the warmest winters ever
