

- ♦ A 10-year-old boy died in Pendleton, New York on Wednesday after becoming trapped in a pile of snow. Investigators believe the boy was digging a tunnel into the snow pile when it collapsed on him.
- ◆ Police say a 60-year-old man suspected of allegedly shooting and injuring two Detroit police officers fired at the two policemen "unprovoked" with the apparent intention of killing them. The suspect was arrested late Wednesday blocks from the scene on Detroit's west side where he had earlier opened fire on the two officers.
- ◆ An Alabama woman managed to escape from a reported robbery and kidnapping incident on Tuesday by jumping out of the trunk of a moving vehicle. She told police that the suspect forced her to get into the trunk of a car after she told him that she did not have any money.

### **UNEMPLOYMENT GOES UP IN AREA**

The unemployment rate in Southeast Tennessee went up in every county in January. The McMinn County jobless rate was 6.4% in January, up from 5.6% from December. In Meigs County, the unemployment rate in January was 7.7%, up from 6.6% in December. Monroe County's jobless rate in January was 6.3%, up from 5.5% in December. In Bradley County, the unemployment rate was 5.3% in January, and Polk County's jobless rate was 7.0% in January.
