
♦ FIRE DESTROYS VACANT HOUSE

◆ A white Maryland man accused of prowling the streets of New York City for a black person to "assassinate" has been charged with murder as an act of terrorism. This is the first time the Manhattan District Attorney's office has used the provision since the statute was changed after 9/11.

◆ A Maryland high school student is expected to face charges after a journal with a detailed plan for a mass shooting at her school was found in her home, in addition to a shotgun and bombmaking materials.

They borrowed a 4-wheeler from a resident and drove off-road through darkness, high winds, heavy rain, and downed power lines, and made first contact with victims. The other three officers responded from the north. The officers radioed injury reports to other responders and personally rescued several victims.
