- ◆ A 14-year-old Chicago male has been arrested in connection with the sexual assault last month of a 15-year-old female that was streamed on Facebook Live. The suspect faces felony charges of aggravated criminal sexual assault, manufacturing child pornography and dissemination of child pornography. Additional arrests are expected as the investigation continues.
- One child is dead and at least five other children are hospitalized for apparent carbon-monoxide poisoning after they were found unconscious in the indoor-pool area of a Quality Inn and Suites hotel, in Niles, Michigan on Saturday.
- ◆ Three people have been arrested in connection with the large fire that collapsed a portion of Atlanta's Interstate 85 last Thursday. The suspects were identified as Basil Eleby, Sophia Broner and Barry Thomas. Eleby faces a charge of criminal damage to property. Broner and Thomas were charged with criminal trespass.


