President Trump is planning to nominate a Tennessee legislator to be the new Army Secretary. The White House says Trump has

• Bombs tore through two Egyptian churches as worshippers were observing Palm Sunday. At least 37 people were killed and 100 were injured. The Islamic State group claimed responsibility, and said it would step up attacks on Christians in Egypt.

• Five children were injured during the annual Spring Carnival at a church near Greenville, South Carolina, on Saturday when a wind gust lifted an inflatable bounce house into the air.

• The Tennessee Highway Patrol says a medical condition may be to blame for a deadly crash on Interstate 75 near Ooltewah on Saturday. Taylor Haggard, 22, was traveling southbound at mile marker 12 when she crossed the median and hit a vehicle head on. The driver of the that vehicle was killed. Ms. Haggard received minor injuries.
