State & Local News

◆ BAN ON OPEN ALCOHOL IS DEAD

Governor Haslam's proposal to ban open alcohol bottles and cans in vehicles traveling on Tennessee Roads has failed for the year. Tennessee currently bans drivers from drinking alcohol while at the wheel, but does not extend that prohibition to passengers. As a result, Tennessee loses \$18 million in federal money for road and bridge projects.

♦ HARWELL CALLS FOR "CIVILITY"

House Speaker Beth Harwell is calling for civility among her Republican colleagues in the Tennessee House as the chamber prepares for a potentially contentions debate and vote on Governor Haslam's transportation funding proposal today. Harwell is urging Republican members to "be kind to one another," even if they disagree on the bill that would raise the state's gas tax for the first time since 1989.

◆ MEIGS MAN SENTENCED FOR CHILD PORN

A Meigs County man, 72-year-old Keith Warren, has been sentenced to five years in prison for possession of child pornography. Judge Sandy Matice says he was told it was the largest collection of child porn ever found. Warren could have received a much longer sentence, but his attorney reached a plea agreement with prosecutors for a shorter prison term due to his age and health, and because the indictment was not filed until 2015 which was five years after the raid on his home.

National & World News

- ◆ California police have arrested a man they believe shot and killed three people in three different locations in Fresno, California on Tuesday.
- ◆ Steve Stephens, the suspect in the Cleveland, Ohio, Facebook killing, shot and killed himself after a brief pursuit in Erie County, Pennsylvania, Monday morning. Stephens allegedly killed 74-year-old Robert Godwin Sr. in Cleveland Sunday afternoon and later posted a video of the killing on Facebook.
- ◆ Tech-savvy concert-goers helped police locate a New York man who allegedly stole more than 100 cellphones at the Coachella Valley Music and Arts Festival over the weekend.
- ◆ U.S. Northern Command confirmed Tuesday that two Russian TU-95 bombers were intercepted off the coast of Alaska on Monday evening.
- Investigators continue to search for two missing hikers who were swept away in a Grand Canyon creek on Saturday.
- ◆ Former President George H. W. Bush is hospitalized in Houston with a mild case of pneumonia.

TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks declined amid a sharp drop in the share price of Goldman Sachs, while geopolitical jitters continued. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 113.64 at 20,523.28. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 6.82 at 2,342.19, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 7.32 at 5,849.47.
