STATE & LOCAL NEWS

◆ POLICE/FIRE REPORTS FOR MARCH

The Athens City Council held its monthly meeting on Tuesday evening. The meeting was fairly brief and lasted less than hour. As usual, the council heard reports on police and fire department activity for the previous month.

- Interim Police Chief Rob Davis reported there were 46 thefts in March, 20 assaults, 11 burglaries, seven motor vehicle thefts, and four robberies. Police issued 399 citations for moving violations. There were 74 traffic accidents in March, with 10 injuries. Davis reported there are four vacancies on the Athens Police force.
- Fire Chief Jin Dyer reported that firefighters responded to 53 calls in March. Ten calls were to vehicle accidents, one was to a business fire, and thirteen were false alarms. Damages for the month totaled \$66,000.

♦ AUB ISSUES WATER QUALITY REPORT

Athens Utilities Board has issued its annual Water Quality Report. The report shows that AUB's water quality exceeds all state and federal water quality standards. The drinking water comes from three sources: the Ingleside spring, wells that tap an underground aquifer that parallels Oostanaula Creek, and from the Hiwassee Utility Commission. To ensure superior water, AUB performs year-round tests at wells and springs, at the AUB water treatment plant, at points throughout the distribution system, and at selected homes and businesses.

National - World News

- ◆ The Interior Department announced on Wednesday that visits to National Parks brought in more than \$34.9 billion to the U.S. economy in 2016, which is an increase of nearly \$3 billion from the previous year.
- ◆ U.S. Secretary of State Rex Tillerson said that the Trump administration is reviewing the Obama-era nuclear weapons agreement with Iran to determine whether they will stop the deal's suspension of U.S. sanctions.
- ◆ A U.S. official says that Syria has moved all of the aircraft from the airbase that was struck by U.S. missiles two weeks ago to an airbase in Latakia that is used by Russia for missions within Syria.
- ◆ President Donald Trump welcomed the New England Patriots to the White House Wednesday afternoon, praising coach Bill Belichick and the team's owner Bob Kraft and many of the players who were present.
- ◆ Bill O'Reilly responded Wednesday afternoon to news that he will not be returning to his top-rated Fox News Channel show The O'Reilly Factor, by saying "it is tremendously disheartening that we part ways due to completely unfounded claims."
- ◆ Las Vegas now has vending machines that dispense clean needles for IV drug users.
