◆ AUB RECORDS 4.11 INCHES OF RAIN

The official rainfall total for this past weekend was 4.11 inches according to Athens Utilities Board. Some parts of the area may have gotten more than that. Schools were cancelled in McMinn and Meigs counties due to flooded roads. AUB says they made it through the storms without any widespread power outages. The heavy rains did cause several wastewater lines to fill up and overflow from customers' cleanouts and manholes. The heavy rains loosened the earth and caused a large tree to fall on top of the house (below) on County Road 576 near Englewood. The roof suffered extensive damage, but no one was injured. The Englewood and Athens Rural Fire Departments responded.

National & World News

- ◆ U.S. astronaut Peggy Whitson broke the record for the most cumulative time in space by an American astronaut early Monday, streaking past the 534-day record previously held by Jeff Williams. Russian cosmonaut Gennady Padalka's record of the 879-day global record, still stands.
- ◆ In the week that will mark his 100th day in office, President Trump will sign four new executive orders. One calls for a review of offshore-drilling regulations and another directing a review of national-monument designations on federal lands. The president also plans to sign an order establishing an "office of accountability and whistleblower protection" at the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- ◆ Police say two people are dead in what is believed to be a murder-suicide at an office building in Dallas. Police believe that a female victim was a supervisor killed by her subordinate.
