STATE & LOCAL NEWS

◆ AS SUMMER HEATS UP, POWER RATES GO DOWN

Summer's heat is here along with the shirt-soaking seasonal humidity so common in the Southeast. But, there is a glimmer of good news. AUB says the local power rate will decrease in August based on a slightly lower monthly fuel charge from TVA. The lower August rate versus July will shave about \$2.80 off the average residential customer's bill based on using 1160 kilowatt hours of energy. However, with the heat of August, AUB's Wayne Scarbrough says many homes will use more than 1160 kilowatts. He says you can take simple steps to save on summertime bills such as closing curtains to block the sun, lowering the setting on your water heater by 10 to 20 degrees, and keeping your air conditioner on 74 instead of 68.

♦ CLARIFICATION ON U-TURNS

The Athens Police Department has asked us to clarify the laws about U-Turns. Police say ALL U-Turns in Athens are illegal. However, motorists can use cross-overs on divided streets like Congress Parkway and Decatur Pike west of Congress Parkway to change directions provided there is no traffic light. That is not considered to be a U-Turn because it involves making two left turns. At intersections with a traffic light, such as in front of the Sonic Drive-In, it is illegal to make a U-Turn. You can go west on Decatur Pike past the light and turn around at the first cross-over.

◆ Arizona Sen. John McCain is at home recovering from surgery to remove a clot from his left eye. Subsequent tissue pathology revealed that a primary brain tumor known as a glioblastoma was associated with the blood clot. The senator tweeted that he greatly appreciates the outpouring of support, and that "Unfortunately for my sparring partners in Congress, I'll be back soon, so stand-by!" ◆ O.J. Simpson was granted parole Thursday after almost nine years in prison for a Las Vegas robbery. He could be released
