◆ POWER RATES TO REMAIN STEADY

Local electric power rates for February will edge up compared to January, but very little. The local residential power rate for February for Athens Utilities customers will be \$0.08783 compared to January's \$0.08749. Both months are considered "winter" rate schedule months by TVA and, therefore, have the same base rate. AUB's Wayne Scarbrough says meter readers report that for the past couple of weeks energy use, as expected, was notably higher in response to the extremely cold weather. Scarbrough says you can save on your electric bill by keeping your thermostat set at 68 degrees rather than 72.

◆ 3 ATHENS TEENS JAILED FOR MURDER

Three teenagers from Athens have been charged in a murder in Polk County that happened earlier this month. Robert Jerome Benton, 18, was taken into custody along with two juveniles. Police say the three victims knew the three suspects. Police say there was an exchange of property taking place when an argument broke out and a fight started. Then one of the three teens from Athens pulled a gun and started shooting at the home in the 9800 block of Highway 411 in Polk County. Timothy Maklain Lawson of Bradley County was killed. Charles Buffkin of Polk County was wounded. A third person, James Meeks of Bradley County, was not injured. The three Athens teens are charged with felony murder and especially aggravated robbery.

Hiwassee River Rail Sets Record

The Hiwassee River Rail Adventure had a record breaking passenger year on the "Old Line" in 2017. The River Rail Adventure is a partnership of the Tennessee Overhill Heritage Association and the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum. Ridership has increased 43.39% since 2014. The final count for 2017 was almost 17,000 passengers. One of the most popular features of the rail excursion is the luxury dome car (shown below). Plans are to add another dome car to the line this year. They are also looking at the feasibility of adding a diner car. Gerald Hodge, executive director of Tennessee Overhill Heritage Association, says he would like to see more than 20,000 passengers ride the train this year.
