Mike Bell of Riceville has filed legislation directing TennCare to seek a Medicaid waiver from the federal government to exclude facilities in Tennessee that perform elective abortions from receiving taxpayer money. Abortion providers in Tennessee received almost \$1 million in taxpayer funding from 2012-2017.
