John Corina of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department said, "he's a person of interest because he was the last person with her before she went in the water."

◆ Amtrak President Richard Anderson, says that the truck driver involved in the train accident on January 31st in Virginia hit the train by "trying to drive around a cross-block." The Amtrak train was carrying some Republican members of Congress and their families when it smashed into a garbage truck on the tracks in Crozet, Virginia. One person riding in the truck was killed, and several people were injured.

One deer provides as many as 168 meals of venison. Last year, community members in Sen. Bell's district donated enough venison for 7.356


