◆ TODAY IS "FLU SHOT FRIDAY"

The Tennessee Department of Health is urging all Tennesseans who have not yet received a flu shot this flu season to get one as soon as possible, as seasonal influenza remains widespread across the state. Tennessee's county health departments are providing flu vaccine at no charge to patients while supplies last and are holding special "Flu Shot Friday" clinics from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. today, Feb. 16th, at all locations. The flu virus is highly contagious, so it's important for people who are sick to stay home and make every effort to avoid contact with others for at least 24 hours after their symptoms have resolved to help prevent further spread of the illness. This includes staying away from work, school, and other public places while ill. Starr Regional Medical Center reports it performed 382 flu tests in the emergency room in the past two weeks. There were 393 tests done in the second half of January and 244 in the first half of January. At this point, the information on the number of those testing positive for flu is not available

◆ "RUN, HIDE, OR FIGHT"

Tennessee's Department of Safety Commissioner David Purkey says he is stunned that once again that evil has struck at a Florida school shooting that killed 17. Purkey extended condolences and said his agency trains citizens every day to "Run, Hide, or Fight" during an active shooter situation.

National & World News

- ◆ According to the Unification Ministry, South Korea approved \$2.64 million from their treasury to foot the bill for North Korea's participation in the Pyeongchang Winter Olympics.
- ◆ It will take a staggering \$88.2 billion to rebuild parts of Iraq devastated by the war against ISIS. In the short term, \$22.9 billion is needed for Iraq, and \$65.4 billion over the medium term.
- ◆ Puerto Rico could recover nearly all of the electric power capability it lost after Hurricane Maria by the end of March.
- ◆ Thursday, the Senate failed to advance four proposals that addressed immigration reform, one of which was backed by the White House.
- ◆ Two brothers were arrested in New York City on explosives charges for making a bomb. The arrests were made in The Bronx where investigators recovered bomb-making materials. Court records revealed that the brothers were paying minors to strip fireworks of their gunpowder so they could build a bomb.
