- ◆ Wichita police are continuing their search for five-year-old Lucas Hernandez who disappeared around 3 p.m. on Saturday. His 26-year-old stepmother said she saw him in his bedroom before she took a shower and fell asleep. Police were called to the home about three hours later.
- A volcano on Indonesia's Sumatra island sent columns of ash shooting into the sky on Monday which prompted a "code red" warning to airlines by an Australian agency monitoring volcanic ash. Villages were covered in layers of grey ash, which settled on trees and the tops of buildings, motorcycles and cars. Thousands have been displaced in the surrounding area. Seismic activity continues and has kept the alert level at its highest point since June 2015.
- A 7-year-old boy was killed in crossfire in Jacksonville, Florida, on Sunday night, becoming the fifth child to be shot in the city in less than two weeks but the first to die.
