- ◆ President Donald Trump has signed a memorandum directing Attorney General Jeff Sessions to propose new regulations that would ban devices that can effectively turn legal weapons into machine guns.
- ◆ On Tuesday, many of the students rushed from funerals for classmates killed in a mass shooting at their school to buses chartered to take them to the Florida state capital, where they plan to lobby legislators and rally for tougher gun laws and school safety.
- ♦ A British man was arrested and charged with murder in connection with the disappearance of his newlywed wife last May. Lewis Bennett claimed that his wife, Isabella Hellman, fell from their catamaran when it hit something in open international waters while he was asleep in the cabin below deck. TODAY IN HISTORY - FEBRUARY 21^s

1885 - The Washington Monument was dedicated in our nation's capital, 37 years after the start of construction.

1901 - The first Republic of Cuba was created, establishing the island as an independent nation. However, the United States reserved its right to intervene when necessary for the preservation of law and order. A U.S. military government continued to govern the country until Cuba elected its first president in 1902.

1947 - Edwin H. Land publicly demonstrated his Polaroid Land camera, which could produce a black-and-white photograph in 60 seconds. The first commercially available model was first sold to the public in November of 1948.

1958 - Country singer Mary Chapin Carpenter was born. One of her best-known hit records is "Twist and Shout." 1972 - Richard Nixon became the first U.S. President to
