◆ INMATE ON LIFE SUPPORT AFTER BEATING

A Hixson man is on life support after a vicious attack by a fellow inmate at the McMinn County Jail. Tim Cook, 48, was kicked repeatedly in the head last Saturday night after being arrested in Athens on a DUI charge. Cook was in a booking area with Jerrod Jones, 24. Jones attacked Cook for about 20 seconds before guards were able to pull him off. Cook was transported to UT Hospital. Family friends say he has little brain activity after the attack. Jones had been taken to jail for charges of shoplifting, theft, and trespassing. He has since been charged with aggravated assault, and the TBI is investigating the incident.

BB&T Bank has announced that it will close their Athens Main financial center at 204 West Washington Avenue in Athens at 2:00 p.m. on Friday, May 18th. It will be consolidated with the Athens Plaza financial center at 1604 Decatur Pike. If you have a safe deposit box at the Athens Main financial center, you will receive additional information about that service later. BB&T's building on West Washington Avenue has been for sale for the past two years.
