♦ POLICE & FIRE REPORTS FOR AUGUST

Members of the Athens City Council heard the reports of police and fire department activity for August at this past Tuesday night's monthly council meeting.

- Police Chief Cliff Couch said there were 78 thefts in Athens in August, 17 assaults, eight burglaries, seven motor vehicle thefts, and one robbery. Police issued 140 citations for moving violations. There were 95 traffic accidents with 11 injuries. Chief Couch reported there are currently two vacancies on the police force.

- Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 48 calls in August. Three calls were to building fires, nine were to vehicle accidents with injuries, nine were medical assist calls, and 13 were false alarms. Losses from fires totaled \$63,100.00.

• VIVID AWARD TO OVERCOMING FAITH

The Athens City Council presented its VIVID (Very Important Volunteer Individual) Award to Pastor Harold McCowan and the members of the Overcoming Faith Christian Center. Overcoming Faith was recognized for its annual free backpack giveaway. For the past seven years, the church has given away backpacks along with free lunches, free dental supplies and oral health exams, and school supplies. This year, free food and games were also featured at the event along with music. Approximately 500 backpacks were given away at this year's event.


