National News

- ◆ In Valparaiso, Indiana, a school bus driver is under arrest after students took a video of her allowing kids to drive the bus. Joandrea Dehaven McAtee, 27, was arrested on Friday and charged with felony neglect of a dependent. According to police, McAtee allowed three students -- an 11-year-old, 13-year-old and 17-yearold -- to drive the school bus for short distances.
- A woman who allegedly stabbed five people, including three babies, in Queens, New York, has been charged with 5 counts of attempted murder. Yu Fen Wang, 52, allegedly stabbed the victims in what authorities described as a birthing center, which didn't appear to be licensed with New York City or the state. All of the victims are expected to survive.
- An airport worker who hauled a suspected thief off an empty American Airlines Airbus A321 airplane at 2 a.m. last week in Melbourne, Florida, said he knew right away something wasn't right about the 22-year-old. Nishal Kiran Sankat, 22, was charged Friday with three counts related to the alleged attempted theft of the plane. Sankat is a student at a nearby aviation school.

FRIDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks finished mixed, closing out what has been a generally strong week for the U.S. stock market despite ongoing trade uncertainty. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 87 points to 26,744. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 1 point to 2,930, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 41 points to 7,987.
