#### HEAVY RAINS BRING FLOODING

## State's Violent Crime Rate Climbs

Tennessee's violent crime rate continues to rise and is outpacing the national rate. In its latest "Crime In the United States 2017" report issued this week, the FBI said nationally the violent crime rate decreased, but in Tennessee it went up. According to the FBI, Tennessee had a crime rate of 651.5 incidents per 100,000 persons, well above the national rate of 394 per 100,000. The totals also reflect a continued growth compared to 2016, where Tennessee had a rate of 638.5 incidents per 100,000 persons. The report shows Tennesseans were more likely to be victims of violent crimes at the hands of a stranger, with 19,698 victims of violent crimes reporting not knowing the offender. In addition, violent crimes were more likely to take place at a residence than any other place. In 2017, 53% of the victims of violent crimes in Tennessee were white and 45% were black. As for the offenders, 56% were black or African American while 37% were white. Homicides in Tennessee saw a slight increase in 2017 with 7.8 per 100,000 versus 7.4 per 100,000 the previous year. The highest rates of violent crimes in 2017 were aggravated assaults, with 482.9 per 100,000 people. That was up from 2016's rate of 471.2 per 100,000. As for the age of victims, the FBI report shows that 29% of violent crime victims in Tennessee last year were between 20 and 29, while 30% of the offenders were in the same age group.
