Update On Case of Madisonville Teen

The adoptive father of the 14-year-old Madisonville girl who disappeared from her home in January and was found hiding in a house in Wisconsin two weeks later has been bound over to the Monroe County Grand Jury. Randall Pruitt, 41, is accused of raping the 14-year-old girl. His bond was set at \$2 million. Videos found on the girl's phone allegedly showed them taking part in sexual relations. It was later revealed that Bryan Rogers, 31, of Madison, Wisconsin, met the girl through an online game. A federal affidavit says the girl told Rogers she was being sexually abused. He advised her to use her phone to record evidence of her being engaged in sexually explicit conduct with her stepfather and to send it to him. He then is accused of traveling to Madisonville, picking up the girl, and taking her back with him to Wisconsin. At some point, she managed to call the FBI office in St. Louis. An FBI tip led authorities to the home of Rogers, who lives with his mother, in Madison, Wisconsin. The girl was hiding in a closet in the basement where Rogers lived. Rogers indicated he had been planning to turn the video of the teen's alleged rape over to police but decided not to because he thought it would not stand up in court. Rogers is charged in Wisconsin with abduction and faces federal charges of sexual exploitation. If convicted, he faces 15 to 30 years in federal prison. Meanwhile, the 14-year-old girl has been returned to Tennessee, but she is not at home with family. Investigators say she is in a safe place surrounded with people there to help her.

U.S. stocks finished the day higher, led by the communication services and consumer discretionary sectors. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 172 points or 0.7% to 25,412. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 13 points or 0.4% to 2,737, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 55 points or 0.7% to 7,402.
