ATHENS POLICE & FIRE REPORTS

The Athens City Council received the reports from the police and fire departments on activity during January at the council's Tuesday night meeting.

- Police Chief Cliff Couch reported there were 61 thefts in January, 13 assaults, 10 burglaries, 8 motor vehicle thefts, and 4 sex offenses. Police issued 220 citations for moving violations. There were 72 traffic accidents in January, with 12 injuries.

- Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 70 calls in January. Four were to building fires. Losses totaled \$211,300.00.

Fire Destroys Peakland Church

Peakland Baptist Church in Ten Mile was destroyed by fire on Monday. The fire broke out in the church basement. Firefighters from several departments responded, including the City of Athens and the Englewood Rural Fire Department. All that is left of the church is the foundation and part of the front wall. The fire came just two months after the building survived the 4.4 earthquake which was centered near the church. Some fire officials speculated that the fire might have been a delayed result of damage, perhaps to the electrical wiring, caused by the earthquake. Pastor Marcos Riojas says services will be held temporarily in the fellowship hall.
