◆ GOV. LEE INCLUDES FUNDS FOR CENTER

A new McMinn County Higher Education Center may soon become a reality. Tennessee Governor Bill Lee delivered his first State of the State address and presented budget priorities to a joint session of the General Assembly in the House Chamber last night. Included in the budget is \$14.23 million to build a new 51,500 square foot building in McMinn County. It will house classes for the Tennessee College of Applied Technology (TCAT) at Athens, Cleveland State Community College and the UT Ag Extension. The colleges will partner with local industries to train workers in skills needed for area jobs. State Senator Mike Bell and State Representative Mark Cochran said in a joint release that the new center will create tremendous opportunities for the region.


