### ◆ SALES TAX WHEELS ARE ROLLING

The Athens City School Board has voted unanimously to support a sales tax increase to pay for school building improvements. The next stop is up to the Athens City Council. The council meets next Tuesday and is expected to vote on the first reading on an ordinance that would authorize a voter referendum to increase the local option sales tax by three-quarters of a percent. The second and final vote would then be held in the April meeting.

### **◆** ATHENS PARKING ORDINANCES

**Angle Parking:** On streets marked for angle parking, no person shall park any vehicle which has a trailer attached or which has a length in excess of 24 feet.

Two Hour Parking Limit: Drivers who park in Downtown Athens give implied consent to having parking control marks on their tires. Erasure or concealment of those marks is prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to move a vehicle with the purpose of evading parking time limitations to another parking space located within the same city block. The movement of a vehicle less than 30 minutes before or after the expiration of the two-hour limit from one space to another shall be presumed to have been moved with the purpose of evading the parking limitation.
