◆ UNEMPLOYMENT RATE RISES IN AREA

The unemployment rate rose in January in all counties in the Athens area in January. In McMinn County, unemployment in January was 4.1 percent, up from 3.5 percent in December. Meigs County's jobless rate in January was 4.7 percent, up from 4 percent in December. Monroe County posted an unemployment rate in January of 3.8 percent, up from 3.2 percent in December. Polk County's jobless rate was 4.4 percent in January, up from 3.5 percent in December. Bradley County had a jobless rate of 3.7 percent in January, up from 2.9 percent in December. Sixtyseven of Tennessee's 95 counties still have unemployment rates below 5 percent.

◆ SEARCH CALLED OFF FOR ETOWAH MAN

Officials at Rocky Mountain National Park have suspended the search for a 70-year-old Etowah man, James Pruitt. Pruitt had gone on a winter hiking trip to Colorado. His family says they had not heard from him since February 28th. His vehicle was found on March 3rd at the Glacier Gorge Trailhead, a popular starting point for hikes to Alberta Falls and scenic lakes. A 15-square-mile search that included numerous dog teams and an airplane turned up no sign of the Etowah man. Park officials say more than two feet of snow fell in the area between February 28th and March 3rd. Pruitt was making his third winter visit to the park over the past three years.

Main Street & DBA Merge

It's now official. Main Street Athens and the Downtown Business Association have merged. A merger banquet was held last Thursday night. Athens City Manager C. Seth Sumner presided over the "marriage" of the two organizations. Lisa Dotson is the new director of Main Street Athens.
