MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks rose ahead of this week's Federal Reserve meeting in which investors expect the Fed to hold interest rates steady. Energy, consumer discretionary and financial services sectors were leaders, while communication services and utilities sectors lagged. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 65 points or 0.3% to 25,914. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 10 points or 0.4% to 2,833, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 26 points or 0.3% to 7,714.
