♦ PAY RAISE FOR CITY MANAGER

The Athens City Council has voted to give City Manager C. Seth Sumner a 3.5% pay raise. The vote was 4 to 1, with Councilman Dick Pelley casting the lone no vote.

◆ POLICE & FIRE ACTIVITY REPORTS

The Athens police and fire chiefs gave their reports on activity during February to the City Council at Tuesday night's meeting.

- Police Chief Cliff Couch reported there were 61 thefts in February, 16 assaults, 13 burglaries, and four motor vehicle thefts. Police issued 226 citations for moving violations. There were 89 traffic accidents in February, with nine injuries. There is one vacancy on the police department.
- Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 61 calls in February. There were nine calls to motor vehicle accidents. There were 10 calls for medical assistance. There was one building fire. Other calls included an overheated motor, smoke scares, a bomb scare, unauthorized burning, false alarms, and brush or vegetation fires. Losses from fires in February totaled \$7,000.00.

Niota Man Charged in Shooting

A Niota man has been charged with aggravated assault after a shooting this past Sunday. Sheriff Joe Guy says a man from the Philadelphia community, Samuel Murray, was visiting the Scott Anderson residence on County Road 315 near Niota this past Sunday. While he was there, Scott and Tina Anderson got into an

argument that involved a firearm. Sheriff Guy says Murray took the gun to a nearby residence to "let things cool 5'6 down." Later, Scott Anderson went to that residence and demanded that Murray return his gun. At that point, Anderson allegedly shot Murray in the leg. Anderson was arrested Tuesday while deputies were investigating a motorcycle crash on County Road 316. A business owner found Anderson hiding on his property and alerted deputies.



Anderson was booked into the McMinn County Jail on charges of aggravated assault, criminal impersonation, and introduction of Schedule Two drugs into a correctional facility.

WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks were mixed as the Federal Reserve kept interest rates unchanged as expected and announced no rate hikes for 2019. In corporate news, FedEx missed earnings expectations due to slowing international conditions and weaker global trade. U.S treasuries rose. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 142 points or 0.5% to 25,746. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 5 points or 0.2% to 2,827, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 5 points or 0.1% to 7,729.

SEAT BELT USAGE RATE IS UP

The Tennessee Highway Safety Office has announced a significant increase in the state's overall seat belt usage rate, compared to previous years. The usage rate rose from 88.5% in 2017 to 90.9% in 2018. This marks the first year Tennessee's usage rate has surpassed 90 percent. Tennessee's 2018 usage rate also exceeded the national usage rate of 90.1%. To determine the rate of seat belt use, researchers observed more than 27,000 front-seat vehicle occupants, including cars, pickup trucks, vans, and SUVs. The observations shows that females displayed a higher usage rate (94.8%) than males (88.3%). Pickup trucks displayed the lowest usage rate (84.24%).
