

Wednesday's Market Report

U.S. stocks were lower after the Federal Reserve left interest rates unchanged, and Fed Chairman Powell said the bank continues to believe the economy remains healthy and that a slow-down in inflation might be temporary. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 163 points to 26,430. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 22 points to 2,924, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 46 points to 8,050.

LEGISLATURE PASSES HANDS FREE LAW

- A bill that would ban the use of a cell phone without a hands-free device has passed the Tennessee legislature. The bill requires drivers in Tennessee to use a hands-free device if they choose to talk on a phone. Drivers would be allowed to use a mounting device or bluetooth. The bill now heads to the governor's desk. If he signs it, the law will go into effect on July 1st.
- Lawmakers also passed legislation that would prevent the state from revoking or suspending drivers' licenses over unpaid court costs. Instead, they would be issued a restricted license while they pay off their court fines using a payment plan. A restricted driver's license would allow people to drive only to work, school, or church.
