### **Murder Suspect Under House Arrest?**


People are asking why Joseph Wielzen, the man accused of killing an Etowah teenager, was out of jail and able to go wherever he wanted while awaiting trial. WTVC, NewsChannel 9, has done some investigating and here's what they discovered. Wielzen was arrested on June 21, 2018, nearly a year after the body of 18-yearold Kelsey Burnette was found. He was charged with felony murder and aggravated rape and bonded out last September after his bond was reduced from \$200,000 to \$30,000. When he was released, the court clerk said he was on house arrest. However, court documents show that Judge Sandra Donaghy did not put any restrictions on where Wielzen could go while out on bond. He was ordered to wear an ankle monitor, but he was not required to stay at home. NewsChannel 9 says it learned that two months ago, the same judge agreed to remove the monitoring device. He was ordered not to go near Kelsey Burnette's family or their home, but his location would not be tracked. Wielzen is back in jail, arrested last week for vandalism. At the time of Miss Burnette's murder, he was a juvenile. However, he will be tried as an adult.

### **TODAY IN HISTORY - MAY 15th**

**1859 -** Pierre Curie, co-discoverer of radium, was born in France. He and his wife, Marie, shared the Nobel Prize for Physics for discovering radium.

**1918 -** The world's first regular air mail service was established between Washington, D.C., Philadelphia, and New York. The aircraft used was a Curtiss "Jenny" biplane.

**1918** - Country singer Eddy Arnold was born. He was known as the Tennessee Plowboy. His hit records included "Anytime," Cattle Call," and "Make the World Go Away."

**1930** - Ellen Church, the first airline stewardess, went on duty aboard a United Airlines flight from San Francisco and Cheyenne, Wyoming.

**1948** - Hours after declaring its independence, the new state of Israel was attacked by Transjordan, Egypt, Syria, Iraq and Lebanon.

**1972** - Alabama Governor George Wallace was shot and critically wounded at a presidential campaign rally in Laurel, Maryland.
