

Where to See the 4th Fireworks

Tomorrow is the 4th of July, and that means cookouts, picnics, and **FIREWORKS!** Just about every community has a fire-works show. Here are some of them:

- ATHENS. The annual Fireworks Show will be start at 9:30 p.m. in Athens Regional Park. The loop road in the park will be one-way, and there will be areas on the eastern side of the park marked as no parking areas due to the fireworks safety zone. After the fireworks, Decatur Pike will be tapered to one lane in front of the park so vehicles inside the park may exit safely.
- **ETOWAH.** Etowah will have 4th of July activities throughout the day. The fireworks show will go from 9:45 to 10 p.m.
- **CLEVELAND.** Fireworks at Bradley Square Mall beginning at 9:15 p.m.
- **SWEETWATER.** Fireworks in downtown Sweetwater starting at dark.


